PET ONCOLOGY STUDY PREP & INSTUCTIONS-----PATIENT PREP INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. NPO six hours prior to study. (NO CANDY, COFFEE, GUM, JUICE, NOTHING BY MOUTH).
- 2. Patient hydration: drink water liberally after injection (excluding head and check studies).
- 3. Unless ordered by a referring physician, usually catheterization is not applicable for abdominal disease.
- 4. Patients empties bladder prior to the study.
- 5. Patient relaxation is important. Patients sit quietly in waiting room for 60 to 90 minutes after FDG injection in complete relaxation without any activity.
- 6. No strenuous exercising 24 hours prior to procedure. Excessive activity may compromise the outcome of the test.
- 7. Medication with small sips of water is OK.
- 8. PATIENT NEEDS TO BRING PREVIOUS MRI, CT, ECHO, NUCLEAR SCAN, STRESS TEST RESULTS AND OR FILMS.

Diabetic Patients:

- a. May eat and take medicine 4hrs before test, (i.e. limit breakfast to juice and toast.)
- b. Blood glucose needs to be between 50 & 200 or test CANT'T BE DONE
- c. Patients taking oral antihyoerglycemic agents **SHOULD NOT** take them on the day of the exam and should be fasting on the morning of their AM examination or 4hrs prior to the examination.
- d. Intravenous fluids containing glucose or TPN solutions should be discontinued 6 hours prior to the examination.
- > Consult with your physician if there are any questions concerning patient medications
- Post-therapy studies should be delayed for 6 weeks following competition of chemotherapy or radiation therapy if possible. Increased FDG uptake too soon after treatment may reflect tumor necrosis/inflammatory reaction rather than residual viability.
